

## 924 Heritage:



Established Ellington AFB, Dec 1962  
Transferred from Ellington AFB to Bergstrom AFB, March 1976  
Disestablished 27 Sept 1996

The 924<sup>th</sup> Troop Carrier Group, Medium, was established, activated, and allotted to the AF Reserve on 28 December 1962. It was organized on 17 January 1963 as the 924<sup>th</sup> Troop Carrier Group, part of the 446<sup>th</sup> Troop Carrier Wing located at Ellington AFB, Texas. Its early activities included providing special airdrop support to NASA during the Gemini and Apollo space programs. From 1962 to 1967, the unit flew the C-119C & G Flying Boxcars.

On 01 July 1967, the 924<sup>th</sup> converted to the C-130A Hercules and was redesignated the 924<sup>th</sup> Tactical Airlift Group, as part of the 446<sup>th</sup> Tactical Airlift Wing with HQ's at Ellington AFB. Unit members flew more than 120 missions to Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

In July 1972 the unit changed Wings and the 924<sup>th</sup> TAG became part of the 433<sup>rd</sup> Tactical Airlift Wing, located at Kelly AFB,

"The Alamo Wing".

March 1976, the group was relocated to Bergstrom AFB, eleven C130A's at Ellington AFB cranked up and relocated to Bergstrom AFB, where the unit became the first Reserve unit to be assigned there.

In 1977, the 924 TAG converted to eight C-130B's, as part of the 433<sup>rd</sup> TAW HQ's at Kelly AFB.

On 01 July 1981, the 924<sup>th</sup> converted to the F-4D Phantom II and became known as 924<sup>th</sup> Tactical Fighter Group, as part of the 301<sup>st</sup> Tactical Fighter Wing with HQ's located at Carswell AFB.

Jan 1989, the 924 TFG converted to the F-4E.

July 1991, the 924 TFG converted to the F-16A Fighting Falcons and became the 924<sup>th</sup> Fighter Group in Feb 1992.

July 1994, the unit converted to the F-16C.

01 Oct 1994, the 924<sup>th</sup> Fighter Group became a Fighter Wing.

The 924<sup>th</sup> Fighter Wing was disestablished due to the closing of Bergstrom AFB.

27 Sept 1996, the keys were turned over to the City of Austin.

Jack was born Oct. 23, 1926, in Camden , N.J. , the only child of Florence and John Rico't. During World War II, he served as an infantryman in the 24th Division, U.S. Army. In 1948, he joined the U.S. Air Force aviation cadet program at Randolph Air Force Base, San Antonio . He graduated as a second lieutenant, flying F-80 fighter jets. He was deployed to Japan with the 8th Fighter Group, 36th Fighter Squadron, "The Pukin' Pups." Jack flew 125 combat missions in the Korean War, for which he was awarded the Bronze Star and the Distinguished Flying Cross with three oak leaf clusters. During the Vietnam War, he ferried C-130 aircraft to and from the combat zone. After 22 years of active and reserve duty, Jack retired as a lieutenant colonel. He also was a flight instructor for Texas International, Republic Airlines and American Airlines. He was preceded in death by his beloved daughter, Joy Elaine Rico't.
