



Stop Loss, AFRC/CC E-Note:

Greetings,

Reservists and Guardsmen whose service was involuntarily extended beyond an approved separation or retirement date as a result of stop loss may be eligible for Retroactive Stop Loss Special Pay compensation of \$500 for each month they were affected.

The 2009 War Supplemental Appropriation Act set aside \$534.4 million to compensate members, including those of the Reserve components who served on active duty who were affected by stop loss between September 11, 2001 and September 30, 2009. Eligible individuals have until October 21, 2010 to file their claim.
