

924 Heritage:



Established Ellington AFB, Dec 1962
Transferred from Ellington AFB to Bergstrom AFB, March 1976
Disestablished 27 Sept 1996

The 924th Troop Carrier Group, Medium, was established, activated, and allotted to the AF Reserve on 28 December 1962. It was organized on 17 January 1963 as the 924th Troop Carrier Group, part of the 446th Troop Carrier Wing located at Ellington AFB, Texas. Its early activities included providing special airdrop support to NASA during the Gemini and Apollo space programs. From 1962 to 1967, the unit flew the C-119C & G Flying Boxcars.

On 01 July 1967, the 924th converted to the C-130A Hercules and was redesignated the 924th Tactical Airlift Group, as part of the 446th Tactical Airlift Wing with HQ's at Ellington AFB. Unit members flew more than 120 missions to Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

In July 1972 the unit changed Wings and the 924th TAG became part of the 433rd Tactical Airlift Wing, located at Kelly AFB,

"The Alamo Wing".

March 1976, the group was relocated to Bergstrom AFB, eleven C130A's at Ellington AFB cranked up and relocated to Bergstrom AFB, where the unit became the first Reserve unit to be assigned there.

In 1977, the 924 TAG converted to eight C-130B's, as part of the 433rd TAW HQ's at Kelly AFB.

On 01 July 1981, the 924th converted to the F-4D Phantom II and became known as 924th Tactical Fighter Group, as part of the 301st Tactical Fighter Wing with HQ's located at Carswell AFB.

Jan 1989, the 924 TFG converted to the F-4E.

July 1991, the 924 TFG converted to the F-16A Fighting Falcons and became the 924th Fighter Group in Feb 1992. July 1994, the unit converted to the F-16C.

01 Oct 1994, the 924th Fighter Group became a Fighter Wing.

The 924th Fighter Wing was disestablished due to the closing of Bergstrom AFB.

27 Sept 1996, the keys were turned over to the City of Austin.

U.S. plane crash in Honduras kills 3

■ Crew members die after cargo aircraft overshoots runway, slides into city street

TEGUCIGALPA, Honduras — A U.S. Air Force cargo plane overshot a runway, slid into a busy street and burst into flames Tuesday, killing three of those aboard.

After touching down on the runway of Toncontín International Airport in the Honduran capital, the plane rose into the air again.

But it dropped down again, went off the end of the runway and slid 200 yards and into the road, said Col. Fernando Soto, chief of the government civil aeronautics office at the airport.

The plane caught fire as it came

to a stop on a major artery often crowded with cars and pedestrians and lined with offices, stores and fast-food restaurants. It wound up about 100 yards from two gasoline stations.

"I had just gotten off of a bus when I saw the plane was coming right at me," said Luis Armando Montoya. "I ran desperately for the other side of the street. It is a miracle I am safe, but I am still frightened."

The spokeswoman for the U.S. Embassy, Marti Estell, said three people aboard the C-130 died and all seven others were injured. Their names were withheld pending notification of relatives.

No one on the ground was reported injured.

Soto said it was not clear what caused the crash. The Air Force was investigating.

The plane was part of the 440th Airlift Wing based at General

Mitchell International Airport in Wisconsin and was flying out of Howard Air Force Base in Panama. U.S. officials said it was carrying food and electronic goods for U.S. service members based in Honduras.

The United States has at least 800 personnel based at Palmerola air base, 40 miles north of the capital. The three most seriously injured were taken there for treatment, Capt. Jerry Warner said at the base.


Col. Jose LaGuardia, chief of the Tegucigalpa fire department, said the plane spilled more than 4,500 gallons of fuel as it slid from the runway to the street.

The sliding plane swept away several utility poles, knocking out power to much of Tegucigalpa for at least three hours. Police said the boulevard would be closed for a day to allow investigators to inspect the wreckage.

"I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty and justice for all."
