TDY to Little Rock AFB: Ed Copher, Oct 2017

Went to a cousin's funeral in Arkansas, stayed at Little Rock AFB. Very nice lodging (\$60), two room suite with TV in each room, of course called **Razorback Inn**! Anyone that is allowed on base can eat in the chow hall and no ID required. You pay for each item, priced about like a Luby's. The golf course has a great breakfast. Many C-130J's stationed there. Someone crooked all the props.....Ha!





Main gate LRAFB. On 29 April 1975, this Herk was the last out of Vietnam during the fall of Saigon. With over 100 aircraft destroyed on the flight line at Tan Son Nhut Air Base, some of them still burning, it was the last flyable C-130 remaining. In a very panicked state, hundreds of people were rushing to get aboard, as the aircraft represented a final ticket to freedom.

People hurriedly crowded into the Herk, packing in tighter and tighter. Eventually, the loadmaster informed the pilot, Major Phuong, a South Vietnamese instructor pilot, that he could not get the rear ramp closed due to the number of people standing on it. In a moment of inspiration, Major Phuong slowly taxied forward, and then hit the brakes. The loadmaster called forward again stating he had successfully got the doors closed.

In all, **452 people were on board**, including a **staggering 32 in the cockpit alone**. Using a conservative estimate of 100 pounds per person, it translated into an overload of at least 10,000 pounds. Consequently, the Herk used every bit of the runway and overrun before it was able to get airborne.

The target was Thailand, which should have been 1:20 in flight time, but after an hour and a half, the aircraft was over the Gulf of Slam, and they were clearly lost. Finally, a map was located, they identified some terrain features, and they were able to navigate. They landed at Utapao, Thailand after a three and a half hour flight.

Ground personnel were shocked at what "fell out" as they opened the doors. It was clear that a longer flight would almost certainly have resulted in a loss of life. In the end, however, all **452 people** made it to freedom aboard this historic C-130.

Upon landing, the aircraft was reclaimed by the United States Air Force and was assigned to two different Air National Guard units for the next 14 years. On 28 June 1989, it made its final flight to Little Rock Air Force Base, current home of the 314th Airlift Wing, and was placed on static display.

****Note:** Normally a C-130A can carry a max of 40 passengers.

Hey fellow golfers and comrades in arms,

Hope you all had a great and non-laborious Labor Day. Hope you've had plenty of time to chase the little white ball around your favorite courses and get your games ready for next year's 35th Anniversary of the National Retired Military Golf Classic. If not, you still have plenty of time to get those swings grooved and recruit all your retired golf buddies for next year's special event, **29 May – 2 June 2018.**

Your committee leaders recently met with the Founders Group International (FGI) and Oceana Resorts folks to check out offerings from various golf vendors and discuss this year's 35th

Anniversary tournament. We had a great opportunity to look at some great golf “stuff” for our goodie-bag and prizes. So far we’ve picked a shirt color and basic design, but you’ll have to wait until registration to see it! There are many more decisions to make, but we’re sure you’ll be pleased. Of course we’re sticking with the all prime time tee time schedules, morning tee times, and FGI has again agreed that we will be allowed to use 6 to 8 courses with the maximum on each course of about 128... and the **price will remain the same as last year**. We and FGI in coordination with Robin Pringle, Tournament Director with Oceana Resorts, will make the determination early in 2018 on how many and which courses we’ll play once an estimate of our numbers can be established. The ladies will still play 3 different courses. FGI has assured us that they’ll accommodate as many retired military golfers as we can recruit, so if we need more courses we’ll get em’. Our committee is starting a Facebook page and re-doubling our efforts to market the tournament...but more than anything we need **your help** to get the word out. By far the most successful recruiting comes from your personal, face-to-face testimonies about this great event. And please let your eligible golf buddies know that THERE IS NO WAITING LIST. ALL MILITARY RETIREES AND THEIR SPOUSES WILL GET IN IF THEY APPLY.

So regardless of the number of players, and hopefully we can bring back a lot of previous players as well as new folks, we will be playing prime courses during prime time without undue delays. All afternoons and evenings will be free for your friends and families to partake in other vacation activities. We know many folks rent homes and condos at the beach which run from Saturday to Saturday and now you and your friends can enjoy those days at a significantly reduced price. Oceana Resorts may also try to assist in providing economical hotel packages during the week prior to our tournament. FGI is also looking to provide great deals on their lunch/replay programs with even greater savings. More to come from the folks at FGI.

Your committee, Founders Group International, Oceana Resorts, Alabama Theatre, PGA Tour Superstore and our other supporters are dedicated to making this year’s 35th Anniversary tournament a special memory for each and every player and family member. We’ll have a new member orientation this year; bring out some new prizes; provide every player a coupon per round for beer/soft drinks afterwards to socialize with fellow players/comrades; institute competitions during the waiting times for award ceremonies; a few other new ideas; and of course continue to offer comradery on some of the best golf courses around. One more positive change we’ll institute this year...in addition to allowing players over 70 years of age to play from forward tees, we’ll have a **“super senior” tee for players over 80 years of age**. Also in recognition of our loyal and most experienced players, don’t forget to dig up that old NRMGC shirt and compete for the coveted “OLDEST SHIRT” prize.

In recent months poster board signs announcing next year’s tournament have been placed at numerous military golf courses along the eastern seaboard including Ft. Lee, Va; Ft. Lee, Va; Quantico Marine Base, Va; Charleston AFB, SC; Ft. Gordon, Ga, Ft. Benning, Ga; and all military bases we visit prior to the tournament next year.
